Choosing a control for an orphan indication can be very difficult, and the problem becomes even harder in studying an ultra-orphan disease. This talk considers three types of controls: randomized, as was done for Luxterna; historical controls, as was done for Brineura; and the increasingly popular “patient as his or her own control”. The advantages and disadvantages of the three types will be discussed along with the kind of study outcome appropriate for each.
